

# ARTWORK SUPPLY GUIDE

This document has been created to guide you through the correct way to supply artwork for modular vehicle wraps.

Following these guidelines will help ensure your files are prepared in a way that allows for a smooth, efficient production process, reducing delays and avoiding unnecessary amendments.

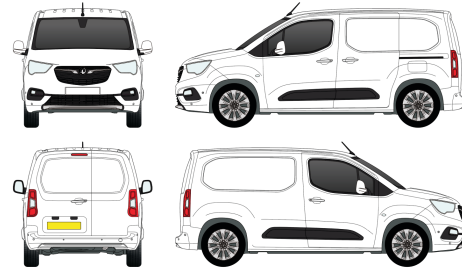

## Step 1.

# (Before you start your design)

### ● Scale

We recommend working at 10% scale, but if you prefer to work at a different scale, please ensure you include a note within the artwork telling us what scale your artwork is set to.

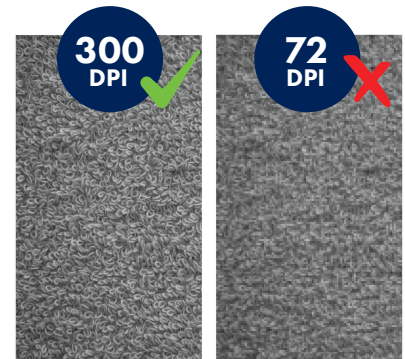


### ● Vectors

Please use vector graphics wherever possible. Having your text, logos & graphical elements as vectors will result in a better quality print and smaller file size

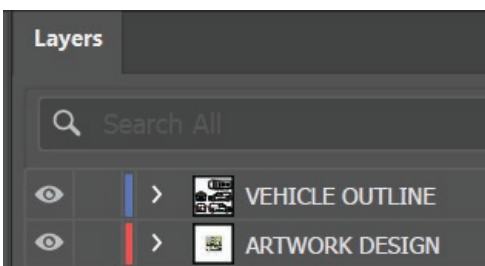
### ● Images

When vectors are not available, or for designs that use photos, please ensure they are high resolution (around 300DPI at full scale)  
If you need to improve the resolution of your images, we recommend this free tool: <https://upscayl.org/> (x2 or x3 upscale is usually sufficient)



### ● Layers

Have your vehicle outline on one layer (top) & all your design elements on another layer (bottom)



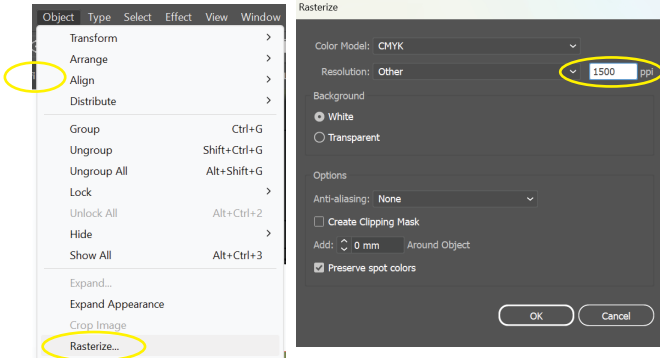
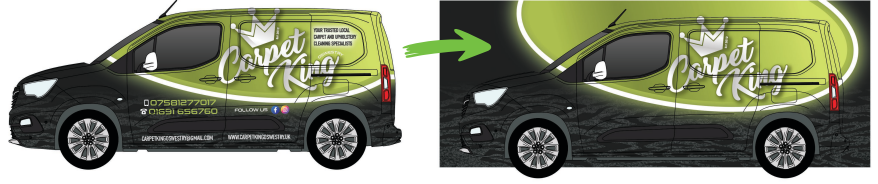

## Step 2.

# (How to prepare artwork when complete)

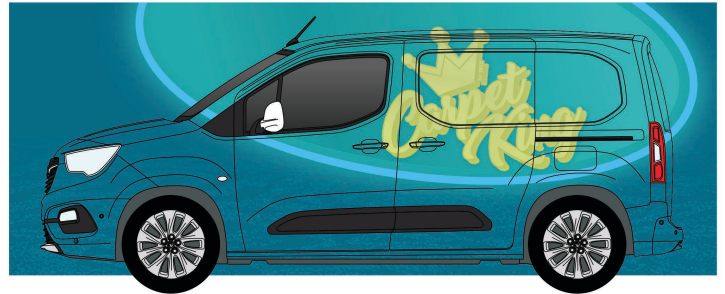
### ● Unclip your artwork

Unclip the design from your vehicle outline and ensure you have plenty of excess design around the perimeter of the vehicle shape.



### ● Rasterise your backgrounds

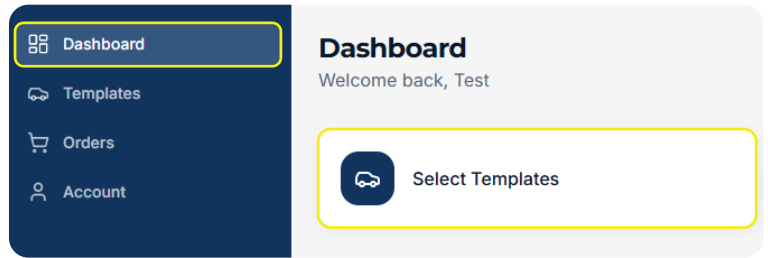
Leave any vector elements as vectors and have them in front/on top of the background image you just created



Rasterise the background of the design along with any shadows/glows or effects in to one flat image (Use 1500dpi to rasterise when working at 10% scale)

### ● Download the template

Download the template from our website that matches your vehicle. (be sure to check: •Age •Wheel base • Sliding doors)



### ● Position the Template

Paste the template on to your artwork layer and move the sections into position.

### ● Clip your artwork

Now use the template to create clipping masks for your artwork.

# (Export your artwork)

## ● Create Artboards

Draw artboards over each side of the vehicle

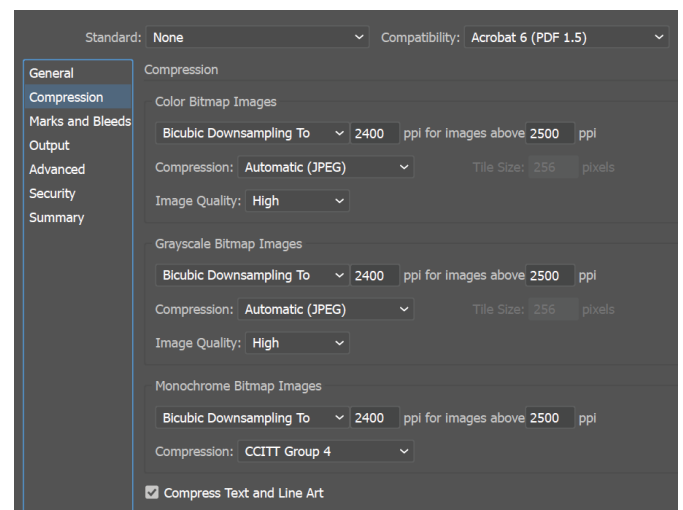
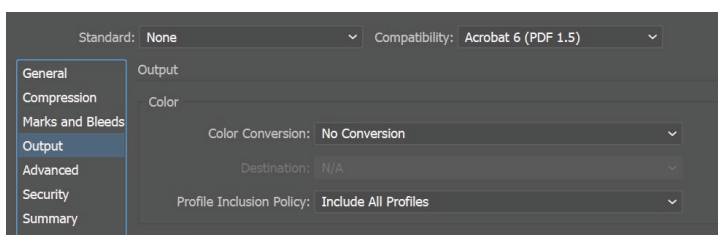
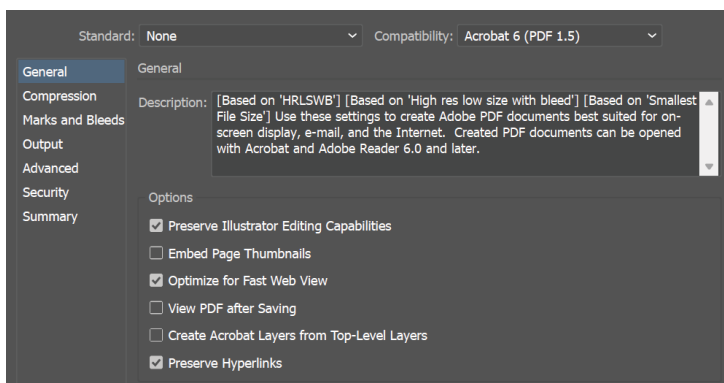
## ● Export artboards



## Step 4.

# (Send us your artwork)

### ● Upload to portal

Navigate to the upload page on our website and attach each of the PDF files you made

Along with photos of the vehicle so we can check for any discrepancies.



### ● Payment

Upon uploading your artwork you will be requested to make payment at this point.

Just follow the steps on screen and pay directly through our website

### ● Artwork review

We will check over your files and let you know if they are suitable or if there are any issues that need to be fixed.

**Note: We only carry out artwork compatibility checks. Any proofing of spelling & other errors in the design is your responsibility.**
